Over \$85,000 Raised to Address Homelessness in L.A.**

**LOS ANGELES, CA** – October 20, 2015 – More than 400 decision makers and women’s advocates gathered Wednesday, October 20th at Vibiana’s in downtown Los Angeles for the third annual Women of Los Angeles City Hall event to tremendous contribution of female leaders to L.A. and raise money for charity.

The event honored Seleta Reynolds, General Manager of the Los Angeles Department of Transportation, and Deborah Ale Flint, Executive Director of the Los Angeles World Airports, recognizing their leadership in Los Angeles.
